THE DEEPER MEANING OF EASTER

What a wonderful time is Easter! Spring bursting forth in all its fresh glory, new clothes, the Easter rabbit, brightly decorated eggs, special meals, family gatherings and all the rest find an answering gladness in our souls. But surely the beauty and fragrance of the flowers are pretty thin and shaky foundations upon which to build our longing hopes, to fulfill our deepest needs, and to answer the basic questions of our lives. Why do we celebrate Easter at all? Is it merely a beautiful tradition handed down from our pagan ancestors who welcomed the coming of Spring?
