ANNUNCIATION OF THE THEOTOKOS

The account of the Annunciation occurs solely in the Gospel of Luke 1:26-38. The event can be divided into four distinct moments: *Moment one*, the Greeting: "In the sixth month, the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a town of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the house of David. The virgin's name was Mary. Upon arriving, the angel said to her: 'Rejoice, O highly favored daughter! The Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women."

Moment two, fear of the Lord: "She was deeply troubled by his words, and wondered what his greeting meant. The angel went on to say to her: 'Do not fear, Mary. You have found favor with God. You shall conceive and bear a son and give him the name Jesus. Great will be his dignity and he will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of David his father. He will rule over the house of Jacob forever and his reign will be without end."

Moment three, announcement of the conception: "Mary said to the angel, 'How can this be since I do not know man?' The angel answered her: 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; hence, the holy offspring to be born will be called Son of God. Know that Elizabeth your kinswoman has conceived a son in her old age; she who was thought to be sterile is now in her sixth month, for nothing is impossible with God."

Moment four, the consent: "Mary said: 'I am the servant of the Lord. Let it be done to me as you say.' With that the angel left her."

Already in the fourth century there is evidence of the celebration of the Annunciation on March 25th. Also commemorated on this date was the Passion of Our Lord. The council of Trullo (692) fixed the celebration of the feast of the Annunciation on March 25th. The feast of the conception and Incarnation of Jesus by the Virgin Mary was observed on this date because it is exactly nine months before the Birth of Christ on December 25th. The feast of the Annunciation is linked with the Spring equinox of March 21st. Many church fathers maintained that Good Friday, the day on which Christ died on the cross occurred on March 25th. In the Lucan account, the Annunciation to the Virgin Mary is preceded by the Announcement of the Conception of Saint John the Baptist. Four momentous events are connected with the four seasons: the conception of John the Baptist at the autumnal equinox (September 24th) and his birth at the summer solstice (June 24th), the conception of the Savior at the vernal equinox (March 25th) and His birth at the winter solstice (December 25th)
